“I am the church, you are the church, we are the church together...” Those words remind us that we don’t go to church, we are the church! Gathering at Talbert Creek Farm for worship, fellowship and picnic on the grounds will be one way to remind us of that fact. **It’ll also be a great way to wrap up the summer!**

What Will We Do?

Instead of coming to Divine Street, we’ll gather out at the farm, located on Old Stage Road, where Crawford Road meets it. We’ll have worship like the early Methodist Camp Meetings – outside. “Three for Him” from Trinity UMC-New Bern will provide the music. We’ll have some chairs, but you might want to bring a lawn chair or blanket to sit on.

After worship, we will enjoy a meal together. It will be catered, so you will be invited to make any donation you can and/or are able to help us cover the costs.

We are hoping to have a mission project in which all ages can participate.

And then, the Snipes family who own the farm, have graciously invited anyone who desires to stay for the afternoon and enjoy the farm, which has a swimming pond, volleyball net, or just hang out.

SPECIAL NEEDS:

Transportation: There are some church members who are unable to drive out to the farm. If you can assist by providing transportation for 1 or more persons from Divine Street to the farm, please contact the church office.

We are looking for this to be a great time of worship and fellowship as we gather as the Church out on the farm!
